# Bambisanani partnership contributes to exam success

MATRIC joy spanned continents after Mnyakanya High School at Nkandla celebrated remarkable Grade 12 exam results with its Bambisanani partners in the United Kingdom.

Of the 126 students who wrote, 91 (72%) passed, with 49 obtaining the entry requirement for university study.

Twenty-seven achieved diploma passes, enabling them to enter technical colleges, while 16 gained higher certificates giving them access to vocational colleges.

Mnyakanya school lies in one of the

most deprived areas of KZN, with water and electricity issues affecting classes, courses and exam preparation, all exacerbated by school closures owing to Covid-19.

Teachers provided additional weekend and evening classes, with Bambisanani coordinator, Mrs PK Zondi, reporting some classes going on until 3am.

This is even more remarkable considering that for many of these students, getting to school involves a two-hour

Mrs Zondi and Principal, Mr Ngubane, praised the contribution of the Menston-based Bambisanani Partnership char-

ity to these results, notably through its water project which brought clean water to the school, allowing it to reopen, and through the Computer Suite initiative jointly funded by Aireborough Rotary Club, eShowe Rotary Club and Rotary International, which has proved to be a significant aid to teaching and learning.

Bambisanani spokesperson David Geldart extended his congratulations to the school.

'Their hard work, dedication and commitment is both amazing and inspirational. The success they have achieved has not come easily and is most thoroughly deserved.'
